WCPSS School Reassignment for Node 587 Submitted by Elizabeth Shugg

As many of you already know, the Wake County Public School System recently made some school reassignments for our node (587). Beginning next year (2009-2010), our traditional elementary school assignment changes from Penny Road Elementary to Baucom Elementary. Some students in our node may also currently attend Apex Elementary since that was briefly our node's traditional option last year.

Beginning in 2010-2011, our node's middle and high school assignments will change from Apex Middle to Salem Middle, and from Holly Springs High to Apex High. WCPSS has recommended that Apex Middle remain our node's traditional option when these changes take place, so families who do not wish to attend Salem Middle, a year-round school, can "opt out" and attend Apex Middle. currently our base middle school. Students attending Lufkin Road Middle, our current year-round option, will be reassigned to Salem Middle beginning in 2010 since it is also yearround. Current Lufkin Road Middle students should be able to remain there as grandfathered students if they desire.

As noted on www.wcpss.net and in a recent News & Observer article, when the

"grandfathering" process leads to approval of a student's transfer. younger siblings who have already begun attending the same school as the older sibling being transferred will also be automatically approved to remain at that school. This mainly applies to elementary and high school students, since rising 7th and 8th graders in middle school are typically allowed to grandfather. A rising 6th grader, however, would not be allowed to attend the same middle school (such as Lufkin) as an older rising 7th or 8th grade sibling, because the rising 6th grader has not already begun attending that school.

If your child is scheduled to begin middle or high school next year (2009-2010), and you would like him or her to attend our 2010-2011 assigned schools (Salem Middle School and Apex High School), you can request a transfer for your child to attend that school a year before the reassignment takes place, since he/she will be reassigned there the following year anyway. If there is space at the school, these transfer requests are typically granted. Also, families with students who currently attend Lufkin Road Middle may also want to consider requesting a transfer for a younger sibling to attend Lufkin IF that student will

not have attended Lufkin when the reassignment to Salem Middle takes place in 2010. The transfer process begins after official school assignments are sent home (typically in mid-May). Below is the exact wording from WCPSS regarding this process:

"The Request for Transfer form is available at all schools, the Central Office Customer Service Desk. and on the school district website at www.wcpss.net/forms. The request must be submitted within ten business days of receiving the official school assignment which is typically sent home on May 15th. The specific reasons for requesting a transfer must be stated by the parent(s) on, or attached to, the request form. The administrative staff of the WCPSS Growth Management Office reviews the initial request for transfer and is bound by provisions of Board Policy 6203. Building capacity, classroom capacity, and diversity in all schools are factors considered when deciding whether to approve or deny a request for transfer. Requests for transfer filed more than ten days after the date of the original receipt of assignment will be denied, except for extraordinary or unusual reasons. Reassignment that is based upon approval of a voluntary request for

transfer results in the waiver of the school system's requirement to provide transportation and the parent assumes responsibility for transporting the student to and from school."

Keep in mind, also, that the N.C. Supreme Court recently heard the Wake CARES case. If the Supreme Court sides with Wake CARES, WCPSS will be required to continue offering all students traditional options for elementary and middle school. If the court decides against Wake CARES, WCPSS will be able to assign students to a year-round elementary or middle school at will, without offering a traditional option. The case was heard this past fall, and supreme court decisions typically take 6 months to come down. We will let you know as soon as that decision has been made.

Magnet School Application Process:

If you would like to apply to a magnet school, magnet applications will be available online starting Feb. 9. The application period ends Feb. 28. Magnet applications will only be accepted online. Reminders Submitted by the Home Owners Association Board

Tuesday – Trash day. Place your trash can and recycle bin by the curb. Please do not put items out to the street until the night before and remember to take them in that evening. Loose items should be secured to

avoid being blown into your neighbors' yards or in the street.

Wednesday and Thursday – Leaves and grass clippings are collected curbside yearround by vacuum trucks. Please bag your animal's waste when you are walking your pets. Town of Apex Ordinance requires it. It also allows our lawns and common areas to look nicer.

For safety reasons, please

close your garage door at night or while you are away.

Please **SLOW DOWN** when driving through our neighborhood. Let's keep everyone safe!

Parked Cars on Streets:

According to the Town of Apex Ordinances, <u>no parking is allowed within 15 feet of a private driveway or near an intersection</u>. Also, "<u>no person shall park a vehicle, whether attended or unattended, so as to interrupt or interfere</u> with the passage of public conveyances or other vehicles."

Please be mindful of how your car affects traffic flow when you park on our residential streets. There is not enough room for vehicles, especially larger ones such as an ambulance or a fire truck, to maneuver around cars that are parked on BOTH sides of the street. Imagine the tragedy that may occur if an emergency vehicle cannot reach its destination in a timely manner due to lack of access on our streets. Furthermore, certain areas in our neighborhood are dangerous blind spots. Some of them include the first intersection of Brasstown Lane and Frissell Avenue and the intersection of Frissell Avenue and Pilot Mountain Court. Therefore, parking at or near these intersections is unsafe due to the additional lack of visibility from your parked car. We appreciate your effort in keeping these points in mind if you decide to park your car on the street.
